MINUTES

A. Call to Order

President Pro Tempore Moore called the meeting to order.

B. Invocation

Pastor Charles Parker, Center Point Church of Christ, led the invocation.

C. Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag

President Pro Tempore Moore led the Pledge of Allegiance.

D. Roll Call

Councilwoman Copeland, Councilman Williams, President Pro Tempore Moore

E. Public Comment

Ms. Donna Craigo spoke on behalf of Karen Krueger, a resident with many potholes on her street. The mayor stated that her property is under an HOA. Several years ago, the city approached the HOA about paving their roads. The HOA did not want to turn over the maintenance of the roads to the city. We will contact them to see if they have changed their mind.

F. Approval of Agenda

Councilman Williams made a motion to adopt the meeting agenda. Councilwoman Copeland seconded the motion. Upon voice vote, the motion passed unanimously.

G. Presentation

Mayor Scott presented a key to the city and a proclamation to Chief Dahlen & Apostle Davis in recognition of their outstanding contributions to our community. They were strategic partners of the Community Safety Awareness Day, and it was a huge success.

H.2. Consider the Apple Study

The mayor explained that APPLE stands for Advanced Planning, Programming, and Logical Engineering. The purpose of the study is to analyze the corridor within the Center Point city limits to address the following:

- Primary areas of pedestrian activity along the corridor
- Desired street lighting
- Median openings that can be closed
- Intersections that should be designated as primary pedestrian crossing intersections
- If there are turnouts along the corridor, could those be consolidated or removed

The mayor serves as Vice Chair of MPO Infrastructure Improvements. The MPO recommends having the study done. This will position the city to be able to apply for funding for parkway improvements.

Councilman Williams made a motion to accept the GMC proposal for the Apple Study. Councilwoman Copeland seconded the motion. Upon voice vote, the motion passed unanimously.

H.3. Consider the installation cost of the equipment for the outdoor fitness equipment at Civitan Park

Councilman Williams made a motion to approve the expenditure to install the fitness equipment at the Civitan Park. Councilwoman Copeland seconded the motion. Upon voice vote, the motion was adopted unanimously.

H.4. Consider canopy quotes

Councilman Williams made a motion to accept the quote from BUILTRIGHT Construction Company for \$9,788.00 to replace the canopy at the library. Councilwoman Copeland seconded the motion. Upon voice vote, the motion passed unanimously.

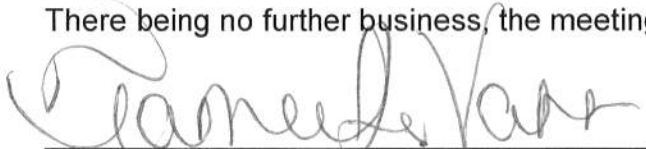

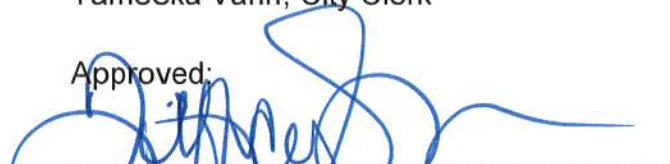
