A. Call to Order

President Collins called the meeting to order.

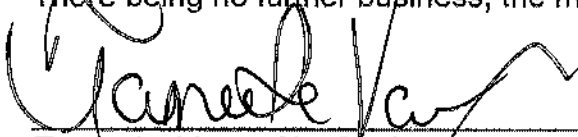

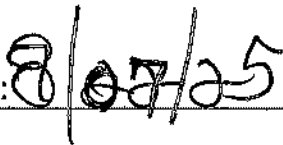
