L.4. Finance/Education & Library- Councilwoman Tasha Hogan

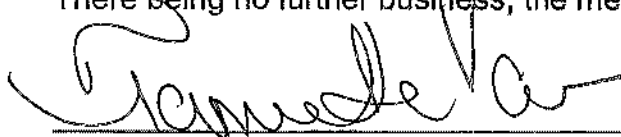
The Mental Health Awareness Workshop is scheduled for May 2, 2026. The Financial Report was distributed to the council.

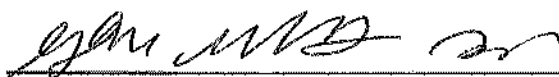
