A. Call to Order

President Williams called the meeting to order.

The city is doing great things. We have an awesome council. We just need to continue to work together.

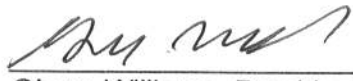

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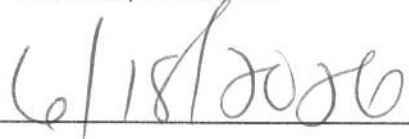
